The Story So Far

The Common Club Tail is a near threatened (IUCN, Red List, 2001) species restricted to unpolluted rivers with moderate to slow flowing water in England and Wales. One of its strongholds is the River Severn in Shropshire.

We need to understand the population size and distribution of the species in order to conserve it. However, records in our database for the Common Club Tail in Shropshire are limited. We intend to change that.



Get Involved

The Shropshire Club Tail Survey aims to record presence or absence of the species in as many 1km squares as possible along the length of the Shropshire Severn.

We are inviting people from across Shropshire to get involved by taking on one or more of these riverside 1km squares. You can give as small or large a time commitment as you like, taking on one or multiple squares.

You don't need any prior experience with Common Club Tail identification. We will provide a survey pack with details of the species identification, a map and a survey recording sheet.
